



Indoor Air

Did you know?

People spend about 90% of their time indoors where the air is usually 2-5 times more polluted than outdoor air.

Action Plan

- Reduce sources of pollution in your home:
 - Do not allow smoking inside.
 - If you smoke, quit: nysmokefree.com
 - Avoid air fresheners, candles, and harsh cleaners.
 - Choose “low-VOC” products (example: paints).
 - Use a stove hood while cooking. With gas stoves, use an exhaust fan vented to the outdoors.
 - Fix water leaks to prevent mold.
- Let the fresh air in! Open your windows regularly.
- Wet dust and wet mop regularly to control dust.
- Install smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors.
- Test for radon in the basement, 1st and 2nd floors.
